to Download and Install Photoshop Elements Go to this page on Adobe.com. Type in the Adobe download code to download Photoshop Elements. Select an option on the page: Download Now, Download Later or Download Immediately. Wait for the download to begin. After it's downloaded, it's ready to be installed. Go to the installation software and follow the on-screen instructions. When the installation process is done, you'll be asked to choose where you want to install the program.

Select the main program folder on your computer. You can also choose your Documents folder if you'd prefer to have the program in your own documents folder. The program should now be installed. If you select the Download Now option when you first go to Adobe.com, you should see an icon for Elements in your Start Menu. Elements is an alternative to Adobe Photoshop. There's not a lot of extra features in it for graphic designers, but it's worth a try for people who don't want to invest in Photoshop. CLEVELAND, Ohio – Police found numerous bodies inside the home of a man who was shot and killed during a Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Office SWAT standoff Saturday afternoon. The standoff started around 3 p.m. at the home on Murray Circle in Maple Heights. Authorities received a 911 call of a domestic disturbance. When deputies arrived, they saw the home owner pulling out of the driveway with a man in the passenger seat. Deputies pulled over the car, after which the driver complied with deputies' instructions and pulled the car over. The man got out of the car, and deputies told him to drop the gun that was in his hand. He also complied with the deputies' directions. The man reached for a gun inside his pants, and Sgt. Alonzo Rock of the Cleveland Division of Police told the man to put his hands on the car and to face away from the home. The man turned and ran. He was armed with a handgun and was wearing a vest with ammunition strapped to it. He refused to drop the gun and allegedly fired a round at deputies. Deputies fired back at the man with a beanbag round and engaged in a firefight with him. The man reportedly returned fire with his gun and went to the house. The standoff was resolved shortly after 10 p.m. with multiple bodies inside the house. Deputies had previously told reporters that the gun was reported stolen. Cleveland Division of Police spokesman Joseph Capobianco said the man's wife and four children were at the home when the incident took place. He was also in a custody battle with his wife. The standoff had been going on for about 40 minutes when it was resolved, Capobianco said. A body was found inside, but it was too early to determine if it was the man who was shot, according to Cleveland police homicide investigators. Police said more than one person died. Capobianco could not confirm that due to the ongoing investigation. Cleveland police homicide detectives are involved in the investigation, and the Summit County Medical Examiner's Office has been called to confirm the identities of the people inside the house, police said. Q: scroll horizontal flexbox I am trying to create a page that will scroll horizontally but I can't seem to get it to work. Here is the codepen: Basically I have a flexbox with a header section that is a fixed height and the rest of the body is a table. The idea is that when the table has more rows than the screen width is it "scrolls". The way I've currently tried to do this is by setting the flex: 1 1 auto to the div that contains the table and then position: relative so that the table has a transform: translateX() to move it left. I am not sure why it is not working though. If you have any ideas I'd be really grateful.
